The City of San Jacinto is updating our Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP). The LHMP is a tool to city uses to analyze and prioritize hazards that may impact public safety. Earthquakes, floods, wildfires, and other natural or manmade hazards are evaluated and incorporated into a plan to reduce or eliminate the hazard. The City of San Jacinto LHMP is multijurisdictional and incorporated into the Riverside County LHMP.

In September 2011, the City of San Jacinto established a special LHMP committee made up of city staff members to include: police and fire, public works and utilities, building and safety, and also included were San Jacinto School District staff, and residents of San Jacinto. The committee has revised the plan and hazard mitigation priorities, of which, will pose the greatest benefit and impact to the city.
